

Dunbar Products, LLC – Statement on Conflict Minerals February 2018

Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform Act, requires persons to disclose annually whether any conflict minerals that are necessary to the functionality or production of a product of the person, as defined in the provision, originated in the Democratic Republic of the Congo or an adjoining country (Angola, Burundi, Central African Republic, Republic of the Congo, Rwanda, South Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda, and Zambia). If so, they must provide a report describing, among other matters, the measures taken to exercise due diligence on the source and chain of custody of those minerals, which must include an independent private sector audit of the report certified by the person filing the report.

None of the heat shrinkable and non-shrinkable insulating tubing products distributed for sale by Dunbar Products, LLC contain any of the listed Conflict Minerals (also referred to as 3TG).

These Conflict Minerals are:

- Tantalum (Columbite-Tantalite)
- ☐ Tin (Cassiterite)
- Tungsten (Wolframite)
